

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR no. 2023/095)

Service provision for conducting <u>onsite cascade training activities</u> with school staff, health promotion specialists, local government representatives in the framework of the project "Shkollat për Shëndetin"

1. BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

As of March 2023, Save the Children have started the implementation of the third year of the main phase of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) Project: "Shkollat për Shëndetin".

The aim of the Project is to promote healthy behavioural practices and healthy lifestyle habits in the Albanian population, with a particular focus on schoolchildren (aged 6-16 years) in order to control and prevent effectively the major risk factors for non-communicable diseases (NCDs) and other health emergencies including COVID-19.

One of the main interventions of the project "Shkollat për Shëndetin" concerns the capacity building of key actors and beneficiaries through provision of training activities, peer-to-peer education, and continuous professional development. Hence, similar to the previous implementation years, the third implementation year of the project "Shkollat për Shëndetin" (covering the period March 2023 – February 2024) foresees a wide range of capacity building activities involving teachers and other relevant school staff, health professionals, local government representatives, as well as key agents of change at community level.

Of note, in the third implementation year of the project, the <u>onsite interventions</u> (cascade training approach) will be expanded in three other regions of Albania that is Shkodër, Vlorë and Gjirokastër following the TOTs delivered previously.

2. AIM AND OBJECTIVES OF THE SERVICE

Aim:

Save the Children is seeking to <u>prequalify</u> (<u>preselect</u>) relevant service providers for <u>eventually conducting onsite cascade training activities in the regions of Shkodër, Vlorë and Gjirokastër for all actors at local level consisting of teachers, health promotion specialists, local government representatives, as well as key agents of change at community level for the needs of the project "Shkollat për Shëndetin".</u>

From this perspective, the focus of these capacity building activities should be on cascade training approach of not only the teachers and health promotion specialists, but also a wide range of other key local professionals at local level. There will be a peer-to-peer training approach, which means that the already trained participants through TOTs will deliver trainings for their colleagues.

Specific Objectives (with further explanations under Section 3: "Approach of the service"):

- To conduct capacity building activities (training sessions-cascade approach) with <u>schoolteachers</u> and other relevant school staff.
- To conduct capacity building activities (training sessions-cascade approach) with <u>health professionals</u>.
- To conduct capacity building activities (training sessions-cascade approach) with <u>local government</u> representatives.
- To conduct capacity building activities (training sessions-cascade approach) with <u>key agents of change</u> at community level.

3. APPROACH OF THE SERVICE

- 3.1. The Service Provider is expected to be capable of eventually conducting and managing capacity building activities with <u>teachers</u> and <u>other relevant</u> <u>school staff</u>:
 - The schoolteachers included in the capacity building activities (training sessions) should consist of the following disciplines: biology, health and physical education, civic education, and primary education. In addition, other relevant school staff should be involved in these capacity building activities including school authorities, school nurses/physicians, psychologists, and social workers.
- 3.2. The Service Provider is expected to be capable of eventually developing capacity building activities with health professionals:
 - The health professionals included in the capacity building activities (training sessions) should consist of local health promotion specialists and

other relevant health professionals attached to health promotion cabinets (pertinent to local health care units).

- 3.3. The Service Provider is expected to be capable of eventually conducting capacity building activities with <u>local government</u> representatives:
 - The local government representatives included in the capacity building activities (training sessions) should consist of a wide range of professionals working at municipalities in charge of education, health, social services, food and nutrition, school infrastructure, as well as other relevant sectors.
- 3.4. The Service Provider is expected to be capable of eventually conducting capacity building activities with key agents of change at community level:
 - The local agents of change included in the capacity building activities (training sessions) should consist of key individuals, groups of individuals at local/community level in the areas targeted for in-depth interventions by the project "Shkollat për Shëndetin".

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR POTENTIAL SERVICE PROVIDERS

The service provider should meet the following criteria in order to address effectively and timely the specific requirements of this call:

- The service provider should consist of a joint venture of at least 2 nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) with specific experience in capacity building interventions with the respective targeted audiences (teachers, health professionals, local government representatives, and agents of change at community level).
- Each organization of the service provider must be a legally registered NGO in Albania and comply with the country's legislation.
- Each of the NGOs must have proven working experience with capacity building activities (provision of training sessions with the respective targeted audiences).
- Each of the NGOs should have proven experience in project management and in report writing.
- Each of the NGOs should have proven ability to meet deadlines and work under pressure.
- Each of the NGOs should have flexibility in responding to the needs of the contracting agency.

5. PROPOSAL

The service provider is expected to submit a proposal, including:

- <u>Technical</u> proposal including, at least, the following elements:
 - Interventional approach of the capacity building activities (onsite cascade training sessions) including the proposed work-plan, timeline, and other relevant elements:
 - Comprehensiveness and coherence according to the specific objectives of this call; Feasibility of the proposed interventions.
- Financial bid/proposal including the following elements:
 - Daily fees in ALL (Albanian Lekë) of the proposed experts (all taxes included), differentiating between senior experts and junior experts.
 - Onsite training cost (breakdown budget for the training cost) for one day training session of at least 12 participants.
- <u>CVs</u> of the each of the NGOs and the key experts proposed, including a summary of expertise areas as per requirements of these "Terms of Reference", demonstrating previous experience in conducting capacity building activities (onsite training sessions) with the targeted audiences (schoolteachers, health professionals, local government representatives, and key agents of change at community level).
- A copy of <u>ID card</u> of the representative of the each of the NGOs.
- Legal registration of the each of the NGOs (a copy of NIPT).

Important Note

Bidders are not expected to provide a total price for the mandate, but rather indicate the daily fees (all taxes included) of the proposed experts and onsite training cost for one day training session for at least 12 participants.

The evaluation of the bids will be done based on the value for money taking in consideration the overall score in function of the profile and experience of the bidding organization, the adequacy of the proposed experts, the fee charged for each of them and fee of one day training session.

The total value of the mandate will be established in a second stage, with the winners, based on a jointly agreed operational planning that respects the budget constraints of the project.

6. AWARD CRITERIA

The award criteria will consist of the following:

Technical proposal: 40%

Financial proposal: 40%

Qualification and experience of the service provider: 20%

7. ADMINISTRATIVE ASPECTS

Interested service providers should submit:

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¹ The manager (CEO) of each of the NGOs must have adequate qualifications (at least a master degree) and proven working experience (at least 5 years) with capacity building activities (training sessions) with the respective targeted audiences (teachers, health professionals, local government representatives, and agents of change at community level).

² The key experts proposed by each of the NGOs should hold a MSc degree in Health Sciences, Education, Social Sciences, or other relevant degrees and should have proven working experience with capacity building activities. All the proposed experts pertinent to the service provider should have excellent oral and written communication skills in both Albanian and English languages.

- i) A <u>technical</u> proposal (approach, work-plan, and the proposed timeline of the activities for each of the NGOs involved),
- ii) <u>Financial</u> proposal indicating if VAT is included or not in the proposal (if the company/NGO is not subject to VAT kindly specify)
- iii) CVs of the NGOs and the respective key experts proposed,
- iv) Copy of the <u>ID</u> card of the legal representative,
- v) A <u>partnership agreement</u> (joint venture) among the NGOs constituting the service provider, with a clear specification of the responsibilities and tasks of each NGO involved and specifying the NGO which will act as the contractor for the service.
- vi) <u>Bank</u> details of the NGO responsible for the financial report as per the partnership agreement (joint venture),

The application should be submitted in English in a sealed envelope. Financial offer should be submitted in a separate envelope from the technical proposal and state if VAT is applicable for such service. On each envelope (technical proposal, and financial offer) it should be written clearly the full name of the current tender/call.
